Scope and Content

The collection consists of personal papers, ledgers and an oversized map.

The collection is basically evenly split between records from William Bassett's days in business in the fur trade in New York City and the running of the dairy farm. The records span from 1855 to 1899 and some records were continued by William's son Williams Hopkins Bassett (Mrs. Crawford's father) into the early 20th century. The records consist of financial ledgers, copies of business correspondence, journals recording the daily activities on the farm from 1878-1892, and assorted loose papers.

Most items can be clearly designated as belonging to the period of working in New York or on the farm, but there are a few items that the demarcation is not clear. The descriptions to follow will basically be divided between work and farm, but the division can be arbitrary.

All the volumes and loose papers are in good to excellent condition. All the volumes were commercially produced and are approximately all the same size. The entire collection could be housed in legal size .5 cubic foot boxes. The loose papers have been foldered. There are some loose papers still in some of the volumes and have not been removed.

Biographical Note

William David Bassett was born 12 August 1827 in the town of North East, Dutchess County, New York. On 26 January 1854, William married Caroline Antoinette Wheeler (born 9 January 1831) in North East. Soon after their marriage, in 1855, they moved to Rochester, New York and started to raise a family.

By 1857, William had moved his family to New York City. The milk was shipped daily in cans by the railroad.

While working on his dairy farm, William kept a daily journal of the weather and work done on the farm. His sons William Hopkins Bassett [called Willie in the journals] and Clarence Wheeler Bassett [who was a physician and practiced in nearby Sharon, Connecticut] are

mentioned often in the journals. The journals reflect the changing seasons of the year which bring their own tasks. Often there is discussion of how a hired worker is faring, or not faring as the case may be [Mrs. Crawford's mother originally came to the farm as a hired worker before her marriage].

He operated the farm until his death on 9 July 1899. The farm's operation was continued by William Hopkins Bassett.

A pedigree chart and other genealogical documents are also available in the collection's accession file.
