### Scope and Content

The collection consists of documents related to the Maar family, and their relations the Ackharts, in the Hudson Valley region. The collection contains 13 letters written by Nathan Ackhart while deployed with the 3<sup>rd</sup> N.Y. Artillery during the Civil War. The letters are addressed to either his sister or Cynthia, whom he married. Robert Maar served in the U.S. Army from 1941-1946 as indicated on his photograph in File 1.33. The Maars and Ackharts are related through the marriage of David C. Maar and Maud Ackhart described in the article in File 1.15. Documents included from around the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century indicate that members of the Maar family belonged to a club called the "Happy Twelve" which would hold an annual gathering usually in November. Ephemera relating to the "Happy Twelve" dates from 1899 to 1912.

#### **Historical Note**

Maude Maar died 1961 December 12.

Nathan Ackhart was born in 1840 and served in the Civil War on the Union side. As indicated in his letters he served with the 3<sup>rd</sup> N.Y. Artillery. Nathan survived the war and died in 1895. The 3<sup>rd</sup> N.Y. Artillery was attached to the forces defending Washington, D. C. and later moved into North and South Carolina. The unit was mustered out in July 1865.
