Historical Note

Julia Amelia Welling (b. 1816 September 7) married Thomas Edwin Parker on January 12, 1847. She died in July of 1893. They gave birth to a son, Cecil Eugene Parker who married Mollie Greene in 1883 and gave birth to Julia Parker, Harold Parker, and Cecil C. Parker (and Mary T. Parker?). Charles B. Green was the father of Mollie Greene.

Thomas Welling, Jr. was born in 1793 and married Sally Furman in December of 1814; they gave birth to Julia Amelia Welling in 1816.
