POLITICAL NEWS FOR WOMEN

The success of the block system of organizing which Mrs. Arthur L. Livermore, chairman of the Women's Executive Committee of the Republican State Committee, has been advocating for months past, was demonstrated in Buffalo and Syracuse during the primary elections just passed, when every enrolled woman voter in these cities was accounted for and brought to the polls.

In New York City there was little increase in the primaries on the part of either the men or women enrolled voters as the nomination of a Chairman for the Board of Aldermen, the selection of candidates for the assembly and judiciary officers did not excite. Updates where majority offices were on, the women outside fenced the men in many instances in doing their full duty as Republicans and citizens. In Syracuse, Utica, Schenectady and other cities where the nominations for city offices determined to nominate the best man for office and so pave the way for the success of the O. O. P. on election day.

In these clubs and committees the women have spent years studying civic conditions and have realized that the election of Republican candidates is essential to the welfare of their communities. Sanity in city government is what the women desire. The election of Republican candidates assures this.

What Syracuse Did.

In Syracuse, Mrs. Florence E. S. Knapp, who is a member of the Women's Executive Committee of the Republican State Committee and vice-chairman of the Onondaga county committee, put over an excellent piece of organization work.

In each election district of the nineteen wards, a complete organization of women has been perfected. The campaign and district committees have named women ward chairmen and district leaders and the district leaders have appointed block workers to canvass every block in the city in which there lives even one woman who, when she registered last October, enrolled with the Republican party.

Each of these women voters was personally visited by a block worker. A report was made at headquarters as to the number of women interviewed, as well as of the total women's enrollment in that district.

Primary day at three o'clock in the afternoon, every block worker in Syracuse was at her primary polling place to check up the list of the women and ascertain who had voted. The women made a special effort to get a record vote for Mrs. Elizabeth C. Robertson and Mrs. Helen McLaughlin, the women candidates for school commissioners.

Woman Candidate for Assembly.

Miss Mary L. Smith was designated as the nominee of the Republican party for member of the Assembly of the 15th district of New York City on Tuesday. She defeated a negro who was her opponent. Miss Smith resides in the Harlem black belt and a large portion of her constituents are negroes.

Miss Smith is a social worker, an athlete and an all-around American girl still in her early twenties.

"To vote is a serious duty and a great responsibility," she says, "and every city should study political and social problems."

Her platform includes vocational training for returned soldiers and their preference in the matter of employment, equal pay for equal work, regardless of sex or color, government control of the cost of living and the curbing of profits in every field and liberty but not license of speech and press.

When one knows something of Miss Smith's education and training, other features of her platform are explained, as for example the promoting of public schools with sufficient military training to prepare our country for any emergency and development along all lines of activity that make for health. For she is a teacher of hygiene and physical training of the Horace Mann School and received her degree at Teachers' College in the same subjects. During her student days she was president of the athletic association, captain of the basketball team, an expert swimmer and dancer and a star hockey player. If elected, Miss Smith will be ready physically to pass any endurance test that the life of a politician may present.

The daughter of Dr. J. Gordon Smith, president of the Harlem Board of Commerce, she has lived in that district for the past twenty years and numbers many friends among the residents.

Elevator Law in Operation.

The law, sponsored by Republican assemblywoman, Mrs. Ida B. Carmala regulating the employment of women as elevator operators, became effective September 1st.

According to the provisions of the law, no woman less than eighteen years old shall be employed as an elevator operator and the hours of work are limited to six days and fifty-four hours each week, not more than nine hours a day, nor before 7 o'clock in the morning or after 1 o'clock at night.

Seats for the operators were to be placed in all elevators before Sept. 1. Exceptions for women operators are given in working hours only, to those more than twenty-one years old, employed in hotels.

Enforcement of the law rests with the state industrial commission. Inspectors from the commission will shortly visit all buildings where the women are employed as elevator operators. It is expected that actual inspection will not begin for a couple of weeks to give owners a few additional days to install seats for operators.

Whether or not the 10 children of Mrs. Emily Knickerbocker, late of Bangall, will share the one-half of the residuary estate bequeathed to her by her brother, Smith J. Sackett, also of Bangall, who died 10 days after his sister did, is the question which is now up for decision in the Dutchess County Surrogate's court.

Sackett provided that a mortgage of \$5,000 be given his nephew, Homer Thompson, and that the residue of his estate be divided equally between his sister, Mrs. Knickerbocker, and his niece, Alice Robinson. The death of Mrs. Knickerbocker complicated the situation and it has been brought to the court to determine whether the 10 children share the half of the residue or it reverts to the two other principal heirs.

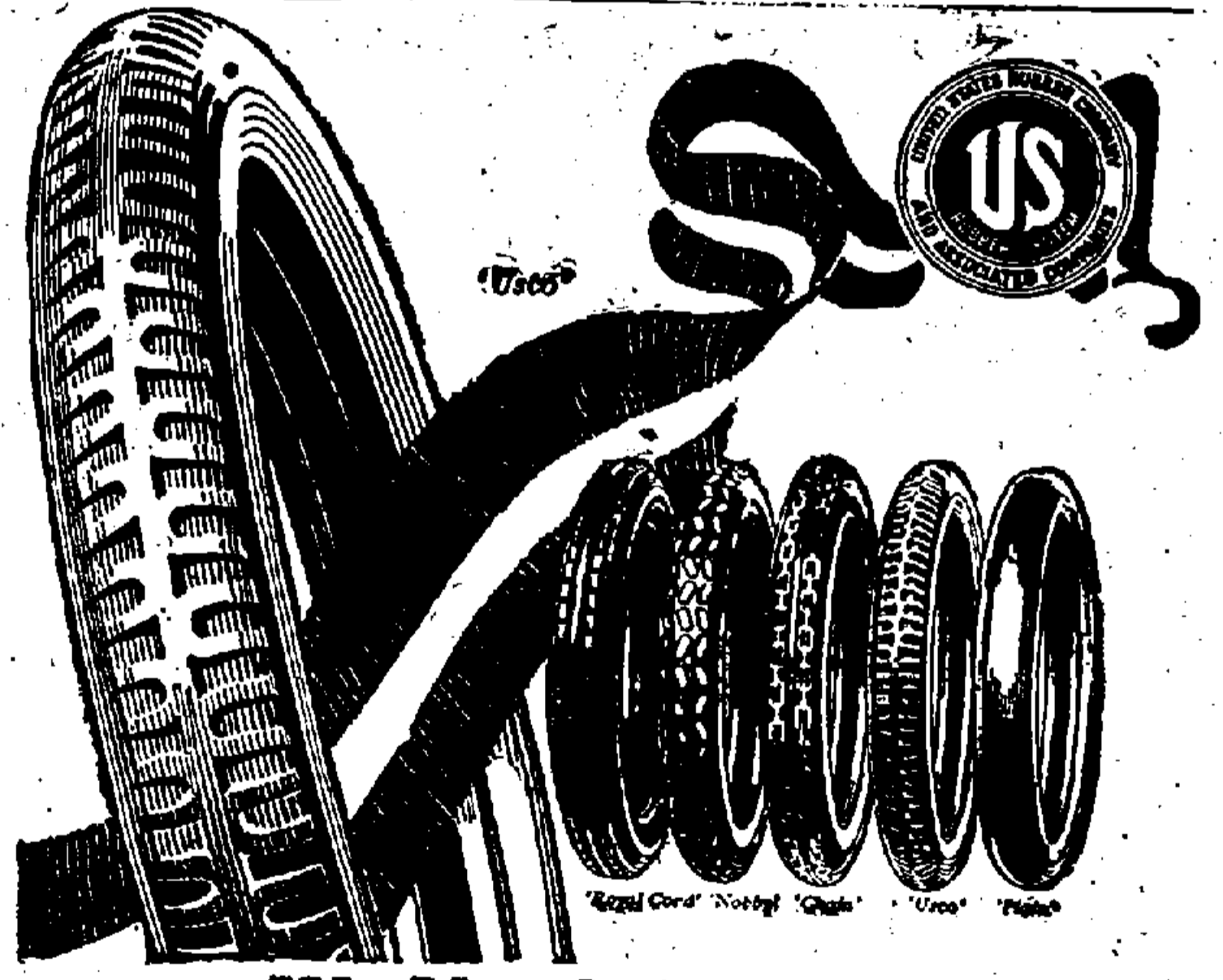

Belgium Rising From Ruins

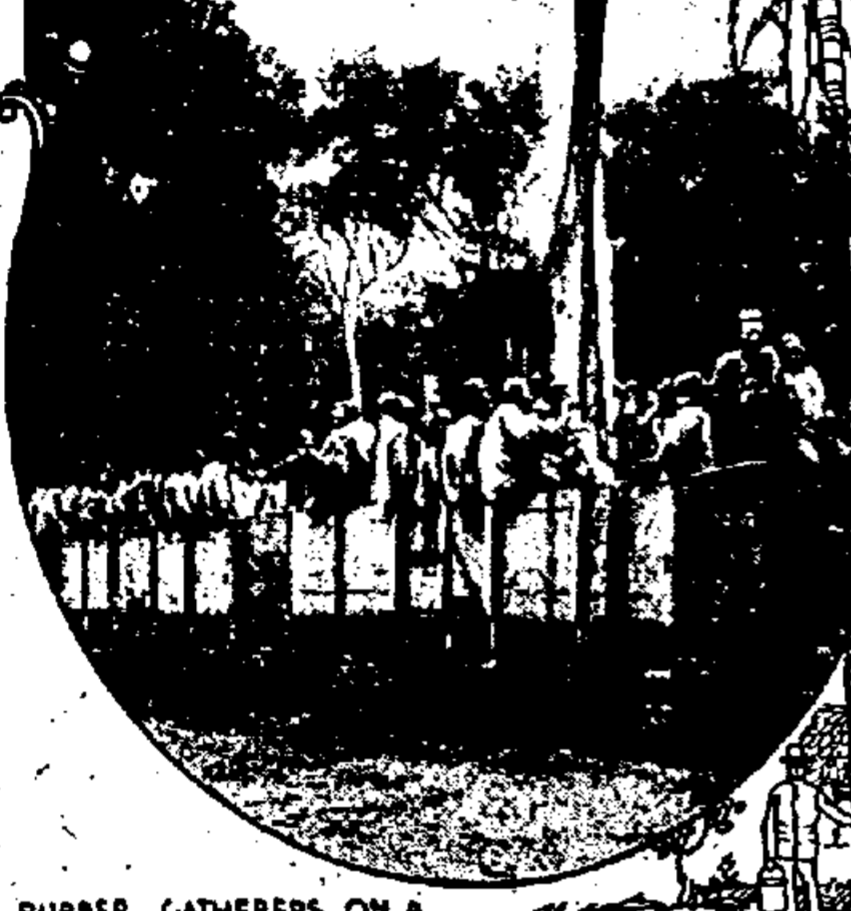
THE Belgians are undertaking their country's rehabilitation with characteristic courage and hope.

In the beginning of its great task Belgium's most urgent need is for commercial and industrial credits which will enable manufacturers promptly to restore and equip their devastated plants and purchase raw materials.

It is to be expected that Government credit will be utilized in the re-development of the country's business in addition to further borrowing to meet the extraordinary national expenses in the period of demobilization. Fortunately the financial condition of the Belgian Government is particularly favorable.

The gross debt of Belgium is 13,422,000,000 francs, equivalent to about \$2,600,000,000, and consists of a pre-war debt of 4,037,000,000 francs and a war debt of 9,385,000,000 francs. Ofsets to this debt are in part: Investments in railways, telegraphs and telephones, approximately 3,000,000,000 francs and deposits of Reichsbank notes 2,000,000,000 marks.

In view of the relatively small national debt, Belgium is in a favorable position in bidding for credit abroad. Moreover, the indemnities should ul-



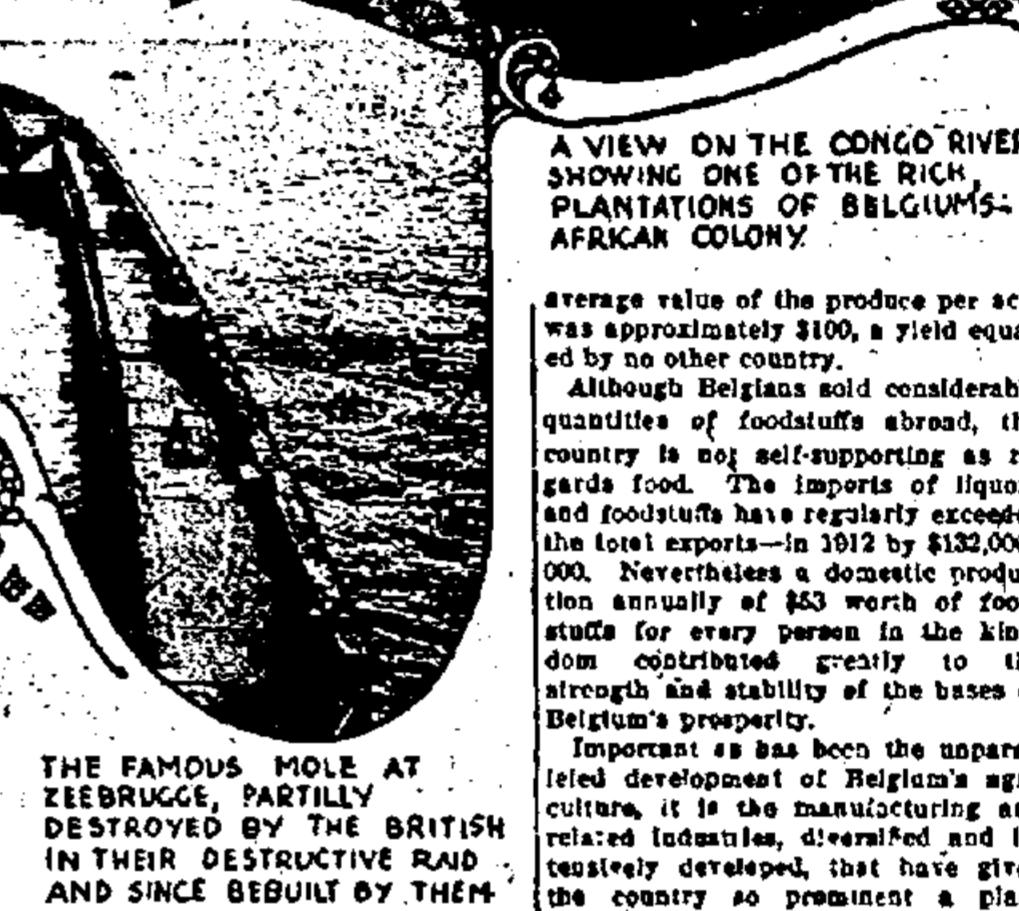

imately more than offset the entire war debt. Meanwhile, even though not immediately available in full, the indemnities, as enforceable claims against Germany, may be used to lend additional support to the credit of Belgium to its borrowings for immediate needs. Incidents, taxes have been light hitherto and for the most part indirect, leaving a wide range of possible expansion

Belgium is rapidly converting her war industries to peace manufacturing. Little smaller than Maryland, Belgium supported in well-diffused comfort a population of more than 7,500,000 in 1914. An excess of immigration over emigration in recent years indicates that an average density of more than 650 inhabitants per square mile has



average value of the produce per acre was approximately \$100, a yield equalled by no other country.

Although Belgians sold considerable quantities of foodstuffs abroad, the country is not self-supporting as regards food. The imports of liquors and foodstuffs have regularly exceeded the total exports—in 1912 by \$132,000,000. Nevertheless a domestic production annually of \$63 worth of foodstuffs for every person in the kingdom contributed greatly to the strength and stability of the bases of Belgium's prosperity.

the industries, has brought about a reversal of trade conditions. The discovery of two new coal fields, one adjacent to the Netherlands border and the other in the southern part of the kingdom, promises to relieve the necessity for reliance upon imported coal in the near future.

Along with the coal resources in the southern provinces are rich deposits of iron ore, but owing in part to legal restrictions governing the extraction of these deposits the production of ore has been small for a long time. Nevertheless Belgium's fifty blast furnaces produced in 1912, chiefly from Luxembourg ores, 2,500,000 tons of pig iron.

In keeping with the development of the iron and steel industry, there has been a significant expansion of various related lines of manufacturing, especially machine and engine works and the construction of railway equipment and automobiles. The zinc, lead, chemical, glass and textile industries are among the other more important enterprises.

The total mileage of the Belgian railways in 1912 was 8,300-2,423 miles of standard gauge roads and 2,471 miles of light, or meter gauge, roads. This was an average of 47.5 miles of lines for each square mile of territory, the greatest railroad density as a whole in any country.

The total foreign commerce, exclusive of transit trade, averaged for the four years immediately preceding the war more than \$1,500,000,000, the average value of the exports being \$702,000,000 and that of the imports \$838,000,000. Of the imports, more than one-half, as measured in value, consisted of raw materials or semi-manufactured goods, and of the exports approximately 40 per cent. was manufactured products.

In the Belgian Congo there is an asset which will prove of increasing importance in the future development of Belgium's industries. In area the colony is eighty times as large as Belgium itself. Although situated in equatorial Africa, its climate is on the whole much more salubrious than that of most tropical countries, because the greater part of the country is a comparatively high plateau. The population of the colony is variously estimated at from 10,000,000 to 15,000,000. Since the annexation of the Congo by Belgium in 1908 industrial enterprise there has been concerned chiefly with preparation for a comprehensive and well rounded development of the colony through the exploitation of its resources—agricultural, forest and mineral.

In 1910 the Government began a comprehensive program of agricultural education and experimentation on which the Administration was to expend approximately \$400,000 a year for a period of ten years. Five fully equipped laboratories were provided and various Government plantations were devoted to demonstration work, both in crop growing and in cattle raising. Particularly gratifying has been the successful experiments with cotton and rice growing, and the Colonial Minister recently expressed the belief that in a comparatively short time the colony would be supplying the factories of Belgium with its raw cotton.
