Of William Wilkinson of Westbury very little is known. In the town clerk's office Westbury P. D. his will is recorded, in which he mentions his wife, Anna Wilkinson, and three children Mary, Anna, and John. The will was made in 1732 and proved in 1733. I am, however, in the Town clerk's office South Kingson it would seem that he had interests there, as well as at Westbury, as the records show that he and his wife Anna bought and sold several pieces of land in the town of South Kingson.

No record of his marriage has as yet been found, but it probably took place about 1708, as his eldest daughter Mary married William Browning in 1738, and it is to be supposed that she was under twenty (certainly not more than that according to the custom of the day) at the time. Following the same argument, William himself, must have been born in the "1680's" or about that, but whether in this country or in England remains to be discovered.

In Vol. IV. Page 80 of the "Records of the Colony of Rhode Island, and Providence plantations" we find that William Wilkinson of Westbury was a deputy in Oct. 1709, and on Page 7 Vol. I of the same work is Gov. Green's letter to the Duke of Newcastle relating to a privateer com-
